## INTRODUCTION - API DESCRIPTION

The Service Test API provides a standardized mechanism for placing a service test with all of the necessary test parameters. The API consists of a simple set of operations that interact with CRM/Service Management systems in a consistent manner. A service test is a procedure intended to check the quality, performance, or reliability of a service.

Service Test Management API manages service test resource and service specification test resource:

- A service test specification describes the service test in terms of parameters to be configured and measures to be taken.
- A service exists for a controlled test invocation on a service. The service test is executed according to a schedule, and contains service test configuration parameters that are to be applied at execution time, and service test measures that result.

This document identifies the parameters that must be included in a request related to the operations above as well as the parameters expected in the response.

The test scenarios in this document are intended to create a set of resources (Service Test and Service Test Specification) and then retrieve the information stored in the server to confirm the resources created are stored with the values originally set. Additionally, some test scenarios are included to verify that the server replies with the corresponding error response in situations where a mandatory attribute is not included in the request.

### Filtered Search:

A filtered search can be applied using query parameters in order to obtain only the resource entities that meet the criteria defined by the filtering parameters included in the query request. Several elements can be applied to the filtered search. In that case logic, a logical AND is applied to combine the criteria

### Filtered Data (Attribute selection):

In order to apply a filter and limit the number of attributes included in the response, the GET request can include the “?fields=” query parameter. Several elements can be applied to the filter. In that case, a logical AND is applied to combine the values will provide in the response only the values assigned to attributes category and channel. Attribute selection capabilities are the same for collections retrieval and individual resource queries

This operation retrieves a service Test entity.  
Attribute selection is mandatory for all first level attributes.  
Filtering on sub-resources is optional for all compliance levels.

## API CONFORMANCE TEST SCENARIOS

This section describes the test scenarios required for the basic CONNECT certification of the API.

Test Cases must be executed in the order defined for each resource because the result from one of the scenarios will be input for the next one.

Requests must be addressed to the endpoint provided for certification, specifically they must be addressed to the URI defined by the concatenation of the {apiRoot} and the specific resource, where the {apiRoot} is defined as {serverRoot}/serviceTestManagement/v2, where {serverRoot} defines the certification endpoint

### ServiceTest Resource TEST CASES

#### Nominal Scenarios

##### TC\_ServiceTest\_N1 – Create new Service Test with minimum required information

- Send a POST message to {apiRoot}/serviceTest/ with the following contents in the BODY

- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 201-Created

  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response matches the values set in the original request

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest/`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one Service Test resource with ID set to `{ID1}`, the same identifier as assigned by the server to the new resource created
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response for the resource with identifier `{ID1}` matches the values set in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest/{ID1}`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response includes a Service Test resource structure that matches the values in the original request

#### **TC\_ServiceTest\_N2 – Create new Service Test with minimum set of parameters supported by server**

- Send a POST message to `{apiRoot}/serviceTest/` with the following contents in the BODY

  - The body of the response matches the values set in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest/`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one Service Test resource with ID set to `{ID2}`, the same identifier as assigned by the server to the new resource created
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response for the resource with identifier `{ID2}` matches the values set in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest/{ID2}`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response includes a Service Test resource structure that matches the values in the original request



**TC\_ServiceTest\_N3 – Search for ServiceTests with specific characteristics**

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes at least two Service Test resources referring to {ID1} and {ID2}
  - The body of the response for the resource with each identifier matches the values in the corresponding original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest?name=test1`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one Service Test resource referring to {ID1} and there is no reference to Service Test resource {ID2}
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response for the resource with identifier {ID1} matches the values in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest?relatedService.id=service1`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one Service Test resource referring to {ID1} and there is no reference to Service Test resource {ID2}
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response for the resource with identifier {ID1} matches the values in the original request

**TC\_ServiceTest\_N4 – Filtered retrieval of ServiceTests**

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest/{ID1}?fields= name`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one Service Test resource referring to {ID1} and including only attributes name, matching the values in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest/{ID2}?fields= relatedService, testSpecification`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one Service Test resource referring to {ID2} and including only attributes name and relatedService, matching the values in the original request

Notice that this test case is using parameters " testSpecification" and " testSpecification" to filter the data included in the response but any other parameter could be used

**TC\_ServiceTest\_N5 – Filtered Search and Filtered data response**

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTest? name=test1& relatedService.id="service1"`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one Service Test resource referring to {ID1} and there is no reference to Service Test resource {ID2}
  - The body of the response for the resource with each identifier includes only attribute description, matching the values in the corresponding original request

Notice that this test case is using the parameter “name” and “relatedService.id” to filter the data included in the response but any other parameter could be used

## Error Scenarios

### TC\_ServiceTest\_E1 – Unknown Service Test identifier

- Send a GET message to `{apiRoot}/serviceTest/{ID3}`, where {ID3} does not match any of the identifiers previously created in the server
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 404-Not Found

### TC\_ServiceTest\_E2 – Invalid Request – Missing mandatory parameter

- Send a POST message to `{apiRoot}/serviceTest` with the following contents in the BODY.

Notice that this request is missing mandatory parameter “testSpecification” , but any other mandatory parameter could be used

- Wait for an error response from the server indicating the mandatory parameter is missing in the request

### TC\_ServiceTest\_E3 – Invalid Request – Missing parameter mandatory in specParameter

- Send a POST message to `{apiRoot}/serviceTest/` with the following contents in the BODY.

} Notice that this request is missing mandatory parameters “id” when information element “relatedService” is included in the request, but any other parameter that becomes mandatory based on the context could be used

- Wait for an error response from the server indicating the mandatory parameter is missing in the request

Note: Not all the test cases is included in this document. There are more test cases in CTK file which is coming soon.

- Send a POST message to {apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/ with the following contents in the BODY

  - Response Code 201-Created

  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters

- The body of the response matches the values set in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one service Test Specification resource with ID set to `{ID1}`, the same identifier as assigned by the server to the new resource created
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response for the resource with identifier `{ID1}` matches the values set in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/{ID1}`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response includes a service Test Specification resource structure that matches the values in the original request

#### **TC\_ServiceTestSpecification\_N2 – Create new service Level Specification with minimum set of parameters supported by server**

- Send a POST message to `{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/` with the following contents in the BODY

  "name": "tspec2",
  "relatedServiceSpecification": {
    "id": "rs2",
```

        "href": "/rs2"  
      }  
    }
```

- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 201-Created
  - Include a location header in the body set to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/{ID2}` where `{ID2}` indicates the identifier assigned by the server to the new service Test Specification resource
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response matches the values set in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification /`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one service Test Specification resource with ID set to `{ID2}`, the same identifier as assigned by the server to the new resource created
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response for the resource with identifier `{ID2}` matches the values set in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/{ID2}`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters

- The body of the response includes a service Test Specification resource structure that matches the values in the original request

### **TC\_ServiceTestSpecification\_N3 – Search for ServiceTestSpecifications with specific characteristics**

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes at least two service Level Specification resources referring to {ID1} and {ID2}
  - The body of the response for the resource with each identifier matches the values in the corresponding original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification?name=tspec2`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one service Test Specification resource referring to {ID1} and there is no reference to service Level Specification resource {ID2}
  - The response message includes all mandatory parameters
  - The body of the response for the resource with identifier {ID1} matches the values in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification?relatedServiceSpecification.id=rs2`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one service Test Specification resource referring to {ID2} and there is no reference to service Test Specification resource {ID1}

- The response message includes all mandatory parameters
- The body of the response for the resource with identifier {ID2} matches the values in the original request

#### **TC\_ServiceTestSpecification\_N4 – Filtered retrieval of a service Test Specification**

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/{ID1}?fields=name`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one service Test Specification resource referring to {ID1} and including only attributes name , matching the values in the original request
- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/{ID2}?fields=relatedServiceSpecification,name`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK
  - The body of the response includes one service Test Specification resource referring to {ID2} and including only attributes objective and name, matching the values in the original request

Notice that this test case is using parameters "relatedServiceSpecification" and " name" to filter the data included in the response but any other parameter could be used

#### **TC\_ServiceTestSpecification\_N5 – Filtered Search and Filtered data response**

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification?name=tspec2&relatedServiceSpecification.id=rs2`
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 200-OK



- The body of the response includes one ServiceTestSpecification resource referring to {ID2} and there is no reference to service Level Specification resource {ID1}
- The body of the response for the resource with each identifier includes only attribute description, matching the values in the corresponding original request

Notice that this test case is using the parameter “name” and “relatedServiceSpecification.id” to filter the data included in the response but any other parameter could be used

## Error Scenarios

### TC\_ServiceTestSpecification\_E1 – Unknown service Test Specification identifier

- Send a GET message to `/{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/{ID3}`, where {ID3} does not match any of the identifiers previously created in the server
- Wait for a response from the server with the following characteristics
  - Response Code 404-Not Found

### TC\_ServiceTestSpecification\_E2 – Invalid Request – Missing mandatory parameter

- Send a POST message to `{apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification` with the following contents in the BODY.

```
{  
  
  "relatedServiceSpecification":{  
    "id": "",  
    "href": ""  
  }  
}
```

Notice that this request is missing mandatory parameter “name”, but any other mandatory parameter could be used

- Wait for an error response from the server indicating the mandatory parameter is missing in the request

**TC\_ServiceTestSpecification\_E3 – Invalid Request – Missing parameter mandatory in objective**

- Send a POST message to {apiRoot}/serviceTestSpecification/ with the following contents in the BODY.

```
{
  "name": "tspec1",
  "relatedServiceSpecification":{

    "href":""
  }
}
```

Notice that this request is missing mandatory parameters “id” when information element “relatedServiceSpecification” is included in the request, but any other parameter that becomes mandatory based on the context could be used

- Wait for an error response from the server indicating the mandatory parameter is missing in the request

Note: Not all the test cases are included in this document. There are more test cases in CTK file which is coming soon.
